President's Message 2023 Annual Report and Annual General Meeting

There is no doubt volleyball and sport in general is back in "full swing"! This past year we have seen a complete return to our sport, free of any restrictions or interruptions. The challenges faced with Covid now seem like a distant past, with event registrations and participant rates back to or higher than pre-Covid numbers. The 2022-23 club, beach, provincial team, and school season was the first "cycle" of programming that was 100% back to normal since the pandemic.

Locally, nationally, and internationally the sport of volleyball is experiencing significant growth. In Manitoba, our strategic initiative of providing grassroots and development opportunities will bear its fruits this fall when we will see Volleyball Manitoba partner with 8 communities across the province as part of our Fall Community Youth Volleyball Program. This program provides youth with an opportunity to learn about the game in a fun and engaging atmosphere. The 2023 Canadian Youth National Championships held in May, saw 16 days of competition, over a 3-week period with a record setting 1,256 teams participating. Manitoba alone sent 154 teams this year to Nationals, our most ever. Volleyball Manitoba hosted the 14U Nationals in Winnipeg, where we saw the need to expand the event to multiple facilities in order to accommodate the demand. A true sign of the growth in the sport of Volleyball internationally occurred this past week when the NCAA Nebraska Cornhuskers women's team played a match in front of a sold-out crowd of 92,003 fans at Memorial Stadium in Lincoln, Nebraska. This set a WORLD record for the largest women's live sporting event ever! That is simply amazing!!

This growth also brings challenges in many areas, including having enough coaches, referees, volunteers, and others to offer and host quality events and programming. Volleyball is also not immune to the economic challenges and the inflation that we have all experienced in our daily lives. Travel costs, facility rental costs, uniform costs and labour costs have all played a part in the overall financial challenges we face in our sport.

With this growth in our game, we as Volleyball Manitoba members need to be aware of our responsibilities as ambassadors and leaders in this sport. We need to continue to work towards providing a Safe Sport environment and a positive culture for all our participants. We need to be mindful of our roles in promoting Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion within our sport. We acknowledge that there is still a lot of work to be done in these areas, but we are heading in the right direction.

I would like to thank the staff at Volleyball Manitoba for their tireless efforts and all the behind-the-scenes work that they do. The work they do for the membership does not go unnoticed. Also, to the Volleyball Manitoba board and committee members who graciously give up their time to try to make our sport better....thank you for your dedication and efforts. I would also like to specifically thank Jennifer Krahn and Michelle Sawatzky-Koop for their dedication and the contributions they have made over their terms as board members.

CLUB VOLLEYBALL 2023



We were extremely happy for a full club volleyball season to start and fully see itself through to the Provincial and National Championships in April and May 2023 without any disruptions, the first in three years.

This past year saw many new clubs and a significant increase in number of teams from 2022, and also an increase from pre-covid registration. With the growth we also saw a lot of new coaches and challenges that came with that in ensuring they met all the Persons in Authority and Technical requirements. With the growth another challenge was in securing adequate facilities for tournaments and provincials, and for clubs themselves facilities needed for regular training.

2023 Volleyball Manitoba Premier Tournaments

As in past years, Volleyball Manitoba delivered several Premier Tournaments in February and March, returning to a full slate of events following a shortened 2022 Season. The Premier Tournament schedule for 2023 included the following:

February 3rd/4th – 17U/18U Premier Tournament 1 – Dakota Community Centre (DCC) & Sport Manitoba *18U Girls (17 teams), 18U Boys (6 teams), 17U Girls (10 teams), 17U Boys (5 teams)

February 10th/11th – 16U Premier Tournament 1 – Dakota Community Centre & Red River College *16U Girls (22 teams), 16U Boys (10 teams)

February 24th/25th – 15U Premier Tournament 1 & 18U Girls Premier 2 – DCC, RRC & Niverville CRRC *15U Girls (20 teams), 15U Boys (12 teams), 18U Girls (6 teams)

March 3rd/4th – 13 Premier & 17U/18U Boys Premier Tournament 2 – DCC & Sport Manitoba *13U Girls (16 teams), 13U Boys (8 teams), 17/18U Boys (12 teams)

March 10th/11th – 14U Premier Tournament & 17U Girls Premier 2– DCC, RRC & Niverville CRRC *14U Girls (30 teams), 14U Boys (13 teams), 17U Girls (7 teams)

March 17th/18th – 16U Premier Tournament 2 – Dakota Community Centre & Red River College *16U Girls (20 teams), 16U Boys (10 teams)

These events help in providing consistent competition opportunities and support and enforce the provincial ranking process along with other sanctioned tournaments that are organized by clubs around the province.

2023 Club Provincial Championships

The Volleyball Manitoba 2023 Club Provincial Championships were held over three weekends in April & May with events being held in Winnipeg, Brandon and in Niverville at their new Recreation Centre. In total, 13 different championships were again organized involving 212 teams.

Participation in the club season and the provincial championships was up from pre-covid numbers, especially at 14U due in part to a 14U Nationals being hosted in Winnipeg. The 212 teams that participated in the provincial events was the most ever and we hope to continue to see growth in the coming years as clubs gain capacity or the number of clubs expand.

2023 Volleyball Canada National Championships

Volleyball Canada wrapped up the 2023 Nationals in May, recording the largest turnout in Nationals history with 1,256 teams competing and over 12,500 players in attendance teams across the six locations of Ottawa, Edmonton, Calgary, Winnipeg, Halifax, Regina.

Volleyball Manitoba would like to congratulate all the Manitoba teams who competed in this year's 2023 Volleyball Canada Championships that were held this past May, scheduled as follows:

2023 14U Volleyball Canada National Championships Hosting

Volleyball Manitoba was proud to have hosted the 2023 Volleyball Canada 14U Championships at the RBC Convention Centre (Girls) and Dakota Fieldhouse (Boys) in Winnipeg. The event took place Friday through to Sunday, May 12-14, with One Hundred Twenty-Eight (128) teams (88 girls, 40 boys) competing on 11 courts at the RBC Conventions Centre and six courts at the Dakota Fieldhouse. This was the first time a National Championship event has been held in Manitoba since 2016.

Although it was a challenge recruiting volunteers for the event, primarily due to many other Nationals being hosted elsewhere in Canada, we'd like to express a huge thanks to those that did sign up and help out at one of the venues assisting us in such areas as set-up and take-down (thank you to the Vision and Pirates 15U Girls teams!), admission, results management and court management. Thanks also to the referees that worked the event and made sure that all 496 matches were well officiated!

2023 TEAM MANITOBA PROGRAMS

2023 was our second year using the Gold, Black, White framework for the Team Manitoba program. This concept was designed to create more opportunities for athlete development across a broader range of ages. Similar models are being used across Canada and we are pleased with how things have progressed.

The vision for the Team Manitoba programming is to create a positive learning environment that will help progress athletes towards their volleyball goals. Athlete development takes time and athletes progress at their own pace. The intent of our current framework is to allow athletes to focus on their development and provide a competitive experience either in Manitoba or nationally at the Canada Cup. We recognize that volleyball can be an expensive endeavor, so we are trying to deliver the Team Manitoba in a way that provides value to families at a reasonable price.

2023 Team Manitoba Gold

Volleyball Manitoba was very pleased to be able to deliver the **Team Manitoba Gold** program, consisting of Manitoba's top 16U 17U & 18U athletes. The Team Manitoba Gold teams were selected in June after a series of sessions, trained throughout July and then competed in the 2023 Canada Cup, July 18-23 at Brock University in St. Catharine's Ontario.

We were able to send 2 Gold Teams in each of the Female and Male categories. One Team played in the Red Division and the other in the White Division. Team Manitoba boys captured the gold medal in both the Red and White Division. Team Manitoba Girls finished 9th in the Red Division and 9th in the White Division.

Congratulations to Dylan Martens, Ashley Lawrence on being selected as Team All-Stars in the Red Division and to Janae Armstrong and Miles Guenther-Hoorman on being selected as Team All-Stars in the White Division.

2023 Team Manitoba Black & White Programs

Volleyball Manitoba's **Team Manitoba Black** (primarily 16U &15U) and **Team Manitoba White** (13U &14U) programs were organized once again in 2023. These programs spent considerable time training on court from late June through the third week of July. These programs were designed to build skills and support an increased number of athletes in our development pathway. Team Black and Team White had approximately 200 total athletes involved which is the largest Team Manitoba program ever. Athletes were split about evenly between the programs and between boys and girls.

The programs concluded at the end of July with the athletes being divided into teams that competed in a Manitoba Cup event on July 21/22 at Dakota Community Centre in Winnipeg.

OTHER VOLLEYBALL PROGRAMS

With the addition to our staff of the Manager of Development and Initiation Programs, we have been able to expand our outreach to new communities in various ways.

Community Youth Volleyball Program

Volleyball Manitoba is happy to have launched their first Community Youth Volleyball Program in January of 2023. This new framework was created to support the development of initiation level volleyball throughout the province. This past year we partnered with 10 communities to provide the program to youth ages 10-16, with many intentions to continue the growth. Although the focus is to introduce and develop the skills of the youth, Volleyball Manitoba is also dedicated to assisting coaches to lead the program. Coaches have been varsity athletes, parents, and community volunteers. By providing coaches with a manual of weekly objectives, practice plans, and other resources, we have been able to create a new group of coaches.



On April 15th at Dakota Community Centre, the Winter 2023 program wrapped up with the first Volley Blast tournament. Following Volleyball Canada's Tripleball competition format the 12U and 14U programs were able to play many games throughout the day. The 12U played 4v4, and 14U played 6v6, providing more opportunities to apply their skills in games. Coaches and other volunteers jumped to action to help initiate the Tripleball sequences and run the tournament.



During the Spring 2023 program we introduced Volleyball Canada's Smashball program to the 12U category. Smashball targets youth ages 8-12 and focuses on increasing physical literacy through a range of activities and games. Smashball is divided into different levels introducing new skills and concepts at each level while always allowing kids to smash(attack) the ball each rally. Presenting Smashball to the Community Youth Program also provided coaches with another resource. Volleyball Canada has created an app with lesson plans, many activities, and technical points for skills, making it accessible and easy for leaders to utilize.

This coming September through November our 2023 Fall program will be underway. With a possible 8 communities, this will be the largest program this year. As we progressed through the seasons, we have been able to

expand from only 12U and 14U categories to 10U, 12U, 14U, and 16U programs as seen below. We hope to see program growth in the coming seasons, providing more youth the opportunity to learn about the game.

Sitting Volleyball

Volleyball Manitoba does not have any ongoing sitting volleyball programs, but we are continuously supporting the discipline as opportunities arise.

With access to a sitting net system, Volleyball Manitoba assists schools present the sport at schools such as Vincent Massey (Winnipeg) in their volleyball academy class. The net is also used for the national team training in Brandon (Chris Bird). Once again, we are appreciative of Chris Bird and Brad Hunter's knowledge in delivering sitting volleyball sessions. This past year, we worked with the Invictus Games team as they trained for their competition in Dusseldorf, Germany September 9-16th.

We will continue to work with schools and communities to promote and grow the game of sitting volleyball.





Adaptive Volleyball

Volleyball Manitoba has partnered with the Persons with a Disability Leisure Guide for Fall and Winter to introduce a new program, "Adaptive Volleyball".

Although sitting volleyball is our Paralympic sport, we would also like to provide another inclusive option. This program will welcome all those using a wheelchair for mobility, or other mobility aids, those with limited movement, a limb prosthetic, and those who are interested in trying a new activity.



With this being a new program, we are excited to try the many different variations. Volleyball is a technical and fun sport that requires significant teamwork. This program will not only present participants with a unique experience, but it will also provide a sense of community.

Volleyball Manitoba will be attending the Accessibility Sport Expo on November 4th at Niverville Rec Centre to promote sitting and adaptive volleyball.

Winnipeg Newcomer Sports Academy & The Grand Mosque



Established in 2019, the Winnipeg Newcomer Sports Academy (WNSA) has been providing sporting opportunities to newcomer youth. Within WNSA's multi-sport programming, Volleyball Manitoba and many coaches have been involved in delivering volleyball instruction for the past few years.

Carolyn Trono, the Founder and Executive Director of WNSA, has also been working with Volleyball Manitoba to re-establish the volleyball program at the Grand Mosque for the Muslim community. The Grand Mosque hosts volleyball sessions for Muslim high-school boys and girls

once a week. As a recent recipient of one of the Sport Canada's "Sport for All" initiative grants, the Mosque's program has been able to replace their equipment and provide their programs with adequate coaching. We are proud to support this program as they encourage more diversity in sport and have begun to pave the way for Muslim youth.

Adult Senior Volleyball

Several volleyball leagues exist throughout the province that provide playing opportunities for adults once they are done with school, age class or post-secondary levels of our sport. This is important as we strive to promote active for life involvement in volleyball.

Volleyball Manitoba's member league, Winnipeg Men's Volleyball League (WMVL) had its 65th season in 2022-23! The season kicked off the third week of September with the Wezer Bridle Exhibition Series (a 2-week mini tournament). The league had 66 teams last year.





It is a strong desire of ours to have other existing adult leagues as members of Volleyball Manitoba, and we continue to dialogue with league organizers and the benefits and value of membership that may enhance the experience of their participants.

This past season we also organized Adult Coed 4 tournaments and will continue to explore these playing options in the upcoming year.

Grade 8 Championship / Grade 9 Open

At the end of each school season, Volleyball Manitoba has organized the Grade 8 Championship and Grade 9 Open events. Grade 8 Division Champions are invited to attend the Grade 8 event, while the Grade 9 event remains an Open competition.

In 2022, the Grade 8 Championship was hosted at Dakota Community Centre on November 25th/26th and saw 13 Boys teams and 13 Girls teams from across the province compete for the title of Grade 8 Champions.

On the Girls side, Holy Ghost emerged victorious, defeating Charleswood in the Final. Grosse Isle defeated Ness in the third place game. On the Boys side, Bruce Middle School defeated Holy Ghost in the championships match, and Roblin defeated Clearspring for bronze.

Thanks to all teams for participating and best of luck in your divisions next year!

The Grade 9 Open did not run in 2022, but we hope to see it back in 2023.





Super-Spike 2023

This year marked our 20th anniversary of Super-Spike, and an action-packed weekend was planned to celebrate this milestone. Super-Spike, presented by Michelob Ultra, was excited to announce that we hit our cap number of volleyball teams at 331 this year before the registration deadline, comprising of over 2,500 participants. This is a 57 team increase from the previous year. Super-Spike did not offer an Ultimate tournament this year due to declining numbers from the previous year's event.





Super-Spike took place at Maple Grove Rugby Park on July 21st and 22nd combining Western Canada's largest outdoor volleyball tournament with a weekend long concert series, all set in a festival atmosphere. This year focused again on dance and pop music, with Canadian stars Noelle and Shawn Desman headlining the Birchwood Automotive main stage at the event.

Super-Spike, in its twentieth year, acts as a significant fundraiser with over \$1.3 million raised to date for local not-for-profits. Funds raised from this year's event supports Volleyball Manitoba, United Way Winnipeg through the events 50/50 raffle, and Shine Toba, a fundraising arm for the fight against Cystic Fibrosis.




TECHNICAL LEADERSHIP

Coaching Development

Like 2022, the 2023 club season saw another increase in the demand for coach education workshops. In 2023 Volleyball Manitoba delivered seven Development Coach workshops between January and April, with 80 coaches completing the online workshops. An increase of 30 coaches from 2022.

Volleyball Manitoba also delivered two Advanced Development Coach Workshops in 2023 to 20 coaches. The Advanced Development Coach Workshop requirement was waived for the 2022 Nationals and Provincial competitions which was the main driver for the increased demand in 2023.

Coaching club volleyball involves a significant commitment, and Volleyball Manitoba appreciates very much the efforts of our clubs and coaches in completing all requirements, including the NCCP training, Respect in Sport (RiS) and Screening requirements. We continue to be at the top of all Provinces in the area of coach compliance.



Volleyball Manitoba would also like to recognize Brandon University for their continued work in delivering the annual **BU** Volleyball Coaches Summit. The BU Coaches Summit took place on September 29, 2022 with an in-person format presented in conjunction with the Bobcat Men's Volleyball pre-season tournament. Featured presenters included: Grant Wilson and Lee Carter from Brandon University, Larry McKay from the University of Winnipeg, Arnd Ludwig from the University of Manitoba, Kevin Neufeld from Assiniboine College, and Bryce Wilson from Brandon University.

Sport Manitoba Coaching also offered numerous online NCCP courses over the past year which many of our volleyball coaches attended virtually and in person.

Coaching Development will remain a priority within Volleyball Manitoba's new Strategic Plan as we determine plans and initiatives to best help advance and support our coaches in Manitoba.

Referee Development

This past 2022-23 season saw an increase in the number of matches as compared to prior to COVID. Both the Winnipeg and Westman region needed to increase the number of referees available for assignment. To help better facilitate the volleyball community throughout the province, we utilized the online Level 1 course developed by the New Brunswick Referee's Association. In total 54 referees completed and passed the online theory training, with 21 being active and getting assigned during the season. On average, there has been about 5 new referees every year, so this increase was welcome indicating that the online approach is more successful than in-person clinics. This approach also allowed us to certify referees throughout the year and allows them to work at their own pace in completing the training.

One of the reasons for the increase in matches to referee was due to leagues that existed prior to COVID having difficulties getting their own referees to come back. Some Junior High leagues have also approached us. Some of these leagues had to be turned away due to lack of MVOA referees, and the timing of their matches. The MVOA did hold 3 Novice clinics for High School kids, who then worked Junior High matches.

In March 2023 the University of Manitoba hosted the Men's U SPORTS Championships this season, and our referees were outstanding. These tournaments provide a higher level of competition and intensity which is a good environment for us to develop our referees.



In May for the 14U Nationals in Winnipeg at the RBC Convention Centre and Dakota Collegiate, 44 referees and 7 Supervisors in total worked the event, where they successfully officiated 496 matches. Manitoba also provided 6 referees and 2 supervisors for Nationals in Regina. Stino Siragusa was nominated to be the 1st Referee for the Gold Medal match. This is a huge honor, and a reward to Stino for his dedication to refereeing. Our other 5 referees were also nominated for medal matches.

The Beach Referee program continues to grow, thanks to Stan Korol for his dedication. This year there were 21 beach referees that were active during the summer beach volleyball season, where they officiated numerous matches for the beach volleyball leagues during the week at Sargent Park or Mape Grove, in addition to the four Premier Open Tournaments and Youth Beach Provincials. Three referees also travelled and refereed at the Volleyball Canada Beach Nationals in Toronto from August 18-20.

The World Police Games were also held in Winnipeg this summer from July 28 to August 6, with the indoor events taking place at Dakota Fieldhouse and the Beach at Sargent Park. Thanks very much to our referees for their support and involvement in both competitions, helping the local organizers deliver successful competitions.



Thanks to the MVOA Executive for their hard work throughout the year, and Volleyball Manitoba for their support.

Referee Development will also be a priority within Volleyball Manitoba's new Strategic Plan in the coming years as we focus on referee recruitment along with development, support and retention of current referees to meet the needs of the demand for referees as volleyball competitions continue to grow.

The pinnacle of his career was being with Team Canada and representing Manitoba at the Canada Games in Beach Volleyball. His competitive nature, compassion for his teammates and thirst to excel was never compromised.

Nikki Redekop Memorial Scholarship

Dale began his volleyball career playing for Lord Selkirk Regional High School and the University of Manitoba Bisons where he was named a five-time All-Canadian, was selected as the CIS/CIAU Most Valuable Player in 1990 and led the Bisons to the national championship title in 1991. He also played on Manitoba's Provincial and Canada Games Teams (85 & 87). He obtained his medical degree from the University of Manitoba, and sadly passed away at the age of 30, after succumbing to Hodgkin's disease, a battle he had fought valiantly for 14 months. Several of Dale's close friends established this scholarship through the Manitoba High Schools Athletic Association and Volleyball Manitoba his honour and memory.

FINANCIAL REPORT & STATEMENTS

Volleyball Manitoba (VM) Finance Committee Report – August 2023

Financial results and position for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2023 are presented in the audited financial statements included in this Annual Report.

As reflected in the financial statements and this brief report, members will see how the organization's programming and finances have almost fully recovered from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In summary;

1. <u>Financial Position</u>. As reflected on the Statement of Financial Position, given an operating surplus of \$30,557, during fiscal 2022-23, the unrestricted Net Assets changed from \$129,300 to \$159,857.

While not having a specific target or mandate to accumulate a reserve, VM's Board of Directors is comfortable with this level of cash reserve to manage seasonal and year-to-year programming and cashflow fluctuations experienced by VM. If the financial surplus continues to grow, Volleyball Manitoba's board and staff will review ways to re-invest back to the sport.

2. Fiscal 2022-23 Operating Results.

Some hi-lights from the Statement of Operations from VM's fiscal 2022-23 activity include the following:

- Operating revenues of \$1,297,612 and expenses of \$1,267,055 for a net operating surplus of \$30,557.
- This is in line, although financially better than the budgeted revenues of \$1,232,100 and expenses of \$1,246,550 for a net loss of \$14,450.
- Revenue from programs such as Provincial Championships and tournaments, Team Manitoba programs and Merchandise Sales mostly returned to pre-covid levels.
- One significant positive variance was with membership fees, having budgeted \$128,000 and realizing \$149,113 at the end of March.
- The return of Super-Spike in 2022 helped support Volleyball Manitoba again with a net of approximately \$30,000.

3. Looking Forward to Fiscal 2023-24.

During the winter and spring of 2023, VM staff prepared, and the Board of Directors reviewed and approved the fiscal 2023-24 Operating Budget.

The budget quantifies several realities and initiatives. Overall, we budgeted for revenues of \$1,376,800 and expenses of 1,377,000 for a modest deficit of \$200. This budget was developed with the understanding of a resumption of normal pre-covid level programming, including Canada Games and Team MB Programming, Provincial Championships, Awards Banquets, and Super-Spike.

A couple forecast updates, hosting Nationals in May was successful and will show a much more positive balance than budgeted, and Super-Spike in July is expected to be successful in the same way. The budget actuals from Nationals will take another month or so to be finalized and we'll have a better idea on Super-Spike in the next 6-8 weeks.

Below is a summarized Statement of Operations showing the 2022-2023 approved budget, 2022-2023 year-end actuals and the 2023-2024 approved budget.

Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended March 31, 2023

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Operating as Volleyball Manitoba, the Manitoba Volleyball Association Inc. is a non-profit organization and is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 149 of the Canadian Income Tax Act. The purpose of the organization is to provide quality services and programs that will assist in the promotion, development, and growth of volleyball in Manitoba.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the organization have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and liabilities are at amortized cost unless otherwise noted. Financial assets and liabilities measured at amortized cost consist of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and deferred revenue.

It is management's opinion that the organization is not exposed to significant credit, currency, interest rate, liquidity or market risks arising from these financial instruments, unless otherwise noted.

Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost and are being amortized on the straight line basis at the following rates based on estimated useful life, except in the year of acquisition, when one-half of the rate is used:

Computer hardware

2 years

The organization reviews captial assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution.

Contributed services and materials

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year. Due to the difficulty of determining the fair market value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended March 31, 2023

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Unrestricted donations are recognized as revenue in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Externally restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized.

The organization accounts for other revenues using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities as at the date of the financial statements, as well as reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. These estimates are subject to measurement uncertainty, and the effect on the financial statements of changes in such estimates in future periods could be significant.

3. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

The company has a line of credit available to a maximum of \$25,000, repayable on demand with interest at the rate of prime plus 3%. Bank indebtedness is secured by general security agreement providing a floating charge on all assets of the organization.

7. GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

Government COVID Assistance consists of the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS), Hardest-Hit Business Recovery Program (HHBRP), Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS), Emergency Support Fund for Cultural, Heritage and Sport Organizations (Sport Emergency Fund), and Manitoba Bridge Grant. The CEWS is equal to 75% of eligible remuneration paid during the qualifying periods to eligible employees. The HHBRP is equal to up to 50% of eligible remuneration paid during the qualifying periods to eligible employees. The CERS is is equal to up to 75% of the rent paid on eligible properties. The Sport Emergency Fund provided additional temporary relief to support sport organization. The Manitoba Bridge Grant program provided payments of up to \$5,000 to organizations for eligible periods.

8. ECONOMIC DEPENDENCE

The organization is economically dependent on the Province of Manitoba which provides funding through Sport Manitoba.
