President's Message

2025 Annual Report and Annual General Meeting

This past year has been one of growth for Volleyball Manitoba, positioning us to continue excelling in our mission of leading and supporting the development of volleyball in our province. The dedication and hard work of our staff, board members, and volunteers have been instrumental in helping us reach new heights.

Volleyball in Manitoba is experiencing remarkable momentum, with participation increasing across a wide range of programs:

- 272 club teams participated in Provincials, up from 239 in 2024.
- 279 beach teams competed in the Beach League, compared to 232 in 2024.
- 341 participants joined the Community Youth Winter Program, a notable increase from 325 in 2024. From September 2024 to August 31, 2025, the program welcomed 628 participants in total.

These numbers reflect not only the growing enthusiasm for volleyball in our community but also the commitment of our members, coaches, and volunteers who continue to invest in the sport and its development.

Through our partnership with the Manitoba Aboriginal Sports & Recreation Council, we had the opportunity to bring the Indigenous Community Youth Volleyball Program to Saint Therese Point in November 2024, introducing the sport to local children and potential coaches in a remote community.

In partnership with the Manitoba Volleyball Officials Association (MVOA), Volleyball Manitoba coordinated efforts to support referee development in rural communities. Over the past year, we delivered referee clinics by sending a trained facilitator directly into communities, providing local officials with valuable training and certification opportunities. This work strengthens officiating capacity across the province and supports the long-term sustainability of the sport. Additionally, we supported a Manitoba referee in traveling to Halifax to attend the Volleyball Canada National Theory Clinic, further contributing to the development of high-level officiating in our province.

This year also brought challenges. Most notably, Volleyball Manitoba received a \$107,000 fee from Volleyball Canada through the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner for Safe Sport investigations referred their way. This unexpected and significant expense underscored the need to better educate our members on appropriate behavior, clarify the difference between a Safe Sport complaint and a general concern, and reaffirm that all complaints are taken seriously. With guidance from Volleyball Canada, we have implemented a new reporting system and engaged a new investigator to ensure both accountability and financial sustainability moving forward.

In May 2025, we proudly hosted the 14U National Volleyball Championships in Winnipeg—our largest event to date. The tournament welcomed 144 teams competing across 19 courts and was executed with great success thanks to the tireless efforts of our staff. While the event highlighted the passion and talent of volleyball in Manitoba, it also revealed challenges related to venue availability, the high cost of renting space at the RBC Convention Centre, and limited government support. These factors will make hosting a championship of this scale difficult in the future, but we can be proud of how we represented both Winnipeg and Volleyball Manitoba on the national stage.

Congratulations to our Canada Games teams who proudly represented Manitoba this past summer. On the beach side, our men's team finished 4th and our women's team 6th. Indoors, our men's team captured the silver medal while our women's team earned a strong 4th place finish.

As I reflect on this year, I want to sincerely thank the staff of Volleyball Manitoba for their tireless efforts and countless hours behind the scenes—your commitment does not go unnoticed. I am equally grateful to the Volleyball Manitoba Board and committee members who generously volunteer their time and expertise to strengthen and grow our sport. Your dedication is deeply valued and appreciated.

CLUB VOLLEYBALL 2025

This past season again saw several new clubs and another notable increase in our number of teams, continuing a trend of growth over the past several years.

Volleyball Canada has lowered the certification threshold to coach at 17U and 18U, which immediately translated to more teams this past season at our 17U categories for both Boys and Girls. We're expecting a similar bump in team numbers at 18U for the 2025/26 season.

Along with the growth in number of teams, the number of coaches continues to rise. This requires additional time and resources committed to coach screening and certification review. Thanks in large part to significant staff efforts we did reach 100% screening compliance among coaches at Provincial Championships.

2025 Volleyball Manitoba Premier Tournaments

Volleyball Manitoba delivered seventeen Premier Tournaments in February and March this season. These events help in providing consistent competition opportunities as well as support and enforce the provincial ranking process along with other sanctioned tournaments that are organized by clubs around the province.

2025 Club Provincial Championships

The Volleyball Manitoba 2025 Club Provincial Championships were held over three weekends in April & May with events being held in Winnipeg, Niverville, Brandon, & Steinbach (and surrounding area). In total, 12 different championships were organized involving 272 teams.

Team Check-In procedure continued to be enforced at our Provincial Championships to help ensure that only eligible coaches and players were in attendance. This is an important step in enforcing our Coach Screening and Certification policies.

Our continued growth is putting a strain on our event hosting with almost all events now requiring multiple venues, and our largest events requiring upwards of 4 venues to accommodate all of the



teams. The 272 teams that participated in Provincials this season were the most ever, and if trends hold, we expect that we may see over 300 teams in 2025/26.




Figure 1: Total number of teams participating in Provincial Championships (2015 - 2025)

The number of teams steadily increased from 2015 – 2019, followed by a sharp dip in 2022, due to COVID-19. Growth resumed strongly from 2023 onward, reaching the highest level in 2025. This trend reflects a temporary disruption and a significant recovery.

2025 Volleyball Canada National Championships

Volleyball Canada wrapped up the 2024 Nationals in May, breaking a record-breaking year as they saw an increase of attendance this year to 1,668 teams, resulting in the largest turnout in Nationals history with 132 more teams than in 2024. These events were spread over 5 weekends in 4 cities, including Ottawa, Fredericton, Winnipeg and Edmonton.

As a province, Manitoba continues to send the fourth most teams to national championships events, behind AB, ON & BC and ranks among the highest in teams attending in relation to number of teams participating in their respective provincial championships.




Figure 2: Total number of teams participating in National Champions (2016 – 2025)

After a decline from 2016 to 2022, participation in national championships rose sharply beginning in 2023. The number of teams attending reached 200 in 2025, marking the highest attendance.

2025 14U Volleyball Canada National Championship Hosting

From May 7–11, Volleyball Manitoba proudly hosted the 2025 14U Volleyball Canada National Championships at the RBC Convention Centre. The event included setup, competition, and teardown, with matches running from May 9–11. Thanks to the dedication of nearly 100 volunteers, both setup and teardown were completed in less than one day each, helping the event run smoothly from start to finish.

This championship marked the largest national volleyball event ever held in Winnipeg, welcoming 144 teams and over 1,800 athletes from across the country. All matches were played on 19 sport courts in a single venue, creating a centralized and accessible tournament environment for athletes, coaches, and spectators. The event demonstrated significant growth from previous years, with 128 teams in 2023 across two venues and just 88 teams in 2016.

Our goals of increasing participation, streamlining operations, and showcasing high-level youth volleyball were all successfully achieved. Thousands of spectators, families, and volunteers filled the venue with energy and enthusiasm, and community feedback was overwhelmingly positive. The championship offered young athletes a memorable national-level experience while highlighting the strength and unity of the volleyball community. A heartfelt thank you goes out to all participants, supporters, and especially the volunteers who made this incredible event possible.

TEAM MANITOBA PROGRAMS 2025

Our Team Manitoba program was once again a success, offering roughly 200 athletes a high-performance development opportunity. The Gold (Canada Games), Black, and White framework supports athlete growth across a wide range of ages, providing a positive and competitive environment where athletes can progress at their own pace, whether competing within Manitoba or on the national stage at the Canada Cup.

2025 Team Manitoba Black & White Programs

The Team Manitoba White program experienced a boost in male participation this year, with the boys' program fielding 26 athletes and the girls program fielding 36 athletes. Serving as the first step in the provincial team pathway, Team Manitoba White focuses on developing athletes' understanding of the game while encouraging them to explore different positions and build the skills needed to perform in each. The program emphasizes growth, versatility, and a positive learning environment, helping athletes lay a strong foundation for future success at higher levels of competition.


Tryouts took place in June, and athletes trained throughout the month of July. The season concluded with the teams competing at the 2025 Manitoba Cup, held July 25–26 in Winnipeg, where athletes showcased the progress, they had made over the summer and gained valuable competitive experience.

The Team Manitoba Black program consisted of the province's top 15U-17U athletes. Tryouts for the program were held in June, with just over 55 athletes per gender selected. This year marked a special milestone, as the program sent one team from each gender to represent Manitoba at the 2025 Canada Cup, some of the youngest athletes Manitoba has sent to the national stage in many years. The experience provided a valuable opportunity for these developing athletes to compete against some of the best in the country, gaining exposure to a higher level of play while representing their province with pride.

Throughout the summer, all athletes trained together in a high-performance environment, focusing on skill development, and game concepts. At the end of July, the program divided into final team rosters to prepare for both Manitoba Cup and Canada Cup.

This year we also hosted a Team Manitoba Boys Black program in Brandon where 15U-16U athletes had the opportunity to train throughout July in Brandon and then come into Winnipeg to compete at Manitoba Cup.

2025 Canada Cup

Canada Cup was held in St. Catharine's, Ontario at Brock University from July 22–27, 2025. The tournament featured two divisions: the Red Division, primarily for Canada Summer Games (CSG) teams, and the White Division, which was open to any provincial teams. Competition ran from Wednesday to Sunday, with each team playing one to two best-of-five matches daily. Manitoba was well-represented, sending a total of four teams—our Men's and Women's CSG teams, along with our Team Manitoba Black Travel program. The Boys and Girls Black Teams competed in the White Division and were made up of athletes aged 15U–17U, with a focus on



selecting younger participants, marking some of the youngest teams we've fielded since the pandemic. Despite their youth, both teams demonstrated growth, resilience, and a competitive spirit, leaving a strong impression on the national stage. The Girls Black team finished 11th overall, while the Boys Black team secured an impressive 6th-place finish. In total, 60 participants (48 athletes and 12 coaches) represented Manitoba. All teams stayed on campus at Brock University, with matches held at Canada Games Park and Brock University Gym, both within walking distance of the residence. Final results also included a 1st-place finish for the Team Manitoba Men's CSG and a 6th-place finish for the Women's CSG team.

2025 Canada Games

The Canada Summer Games are the largest multi-sport event for youth in Canada, drawing more than 4,800 athletes, coaches and support staff from all 13 provinces and territories. The games play

an important role in athlete development and celebrate sport, community and culture. The 2025 Games were hosted in St. John's, Newfoundland & Labrador. Volleyball events were split over 2 weeks, with the beach volleyball competition being held during Week 1 of the games, from August 8 – 17, 2025 and Indoor Volleyball taking place during Week 2, from August 17 – 25, 2025.



Beach

Manitoba sent one men's and one women's team to represent our province. All games were held at Paradise Park just outside of St. John's. Unfortunately, two days of the competition were postponed due to wildfires emerging in very close proximity to the venue. Both Manitoba teams played their



first matches on Monday, then Tuesday and Wednesday matches were postponed. Once the wildfires were under control Wednesday evening, they allowed the competition to continue without any spectators. Spectators were then allowed back into the venue late during the day on Friday. Despite the issues around the venue our teams still managed to make the most of the week. The Men's team placed 4th and the Women's team placed 6th.

Canada Games beach athletes and coaches

Indoor

Team Manitoba's indoor volleyball rosters were finalized during selection camps held in the last week of May. These intensive three-day camps resulted in the selection of 15 athletes for the men's roster and 16 for the women's roster. Each team included 12 official roster players, with 3 alternates on the men's side and 4 on the women's. Following team selection, both groups underwent an extensive training period throughout June, July, and August, which included oncourt sessions five days a week and two weekly strength and conditioning sessions. All training was hosted at Sport Manitoba and supported by additional PEP services provided through Sport Manitoba. To help offset athlete fees, both teams also organized a fundraising camp in the last week of July. Notably, three athletes from the men's roster—Matthew Brown, Ethan Baraniuk, and Simon Oberbuchner—were also selected to the U19 National Team and did not train with the CSG team during the summer. At the Games, the women's team finished 4th overall, while the men's team earned an impressive 2nd-place finish.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL 2025

2025 High School Beach Volleyball Championships

The 2025 High School Beach Volleyball Championships maintained several changes from the past few events, including hosting over 4 days and offering both 2s and 3s divisions. The Championships were held May 28th to 31st at Sargent Park Beach Volleyball Centre and Maple Grove Rugby Park, with the Junior Varsity Divisions taking place on May 28th and 29th and the Varsity Divisions taking place on May 30th and 31st. We continue to see growth at this event, accommodating 412 teams (up

from 320 in 2024) from approximately 60 schools, making this our

largest High School Beach Championships yet.

Thank you to all the athletes, teachers, parents, referees and staff onsite that contributed to the success of the event! It was a great way to start the 2025 beach volleyball season!

Volleyball Manitoba's Annual Beach Volleyball leagues began the week of June 2nd. We offer eight-week Youth Leagues and tenweek Adult Leagues at both Sargent Park Beach Volleyball Centre and Maple Grove Rugby Park, in several different formats.



The following breakdown of team participation shows significant growth since 2022 (our first season post-covid) at both our Sargent Park and Maple Grove beach volleyball venues. In yet another broken record for teams numbers, we had a total of 279 beach teams participating this season:




Figure 3: Number of Beach Volleyball Teams (2017 – 2025) A breakdown of this graph can be found in <u>Appendix G.</u>

Summer Series Premier Open Tournament Series

Thanks to the efforts of Garth Pischke, Co-Chair of the Volleyball Manitoba Beach Competitions Committee, this past summer saw the continued development of our open tournament series. The series included four tournaments over the summer, with prize money determined by the number of teams participating in each of the men's and women's divisions. This year, 100 teams registered over the 4 events (66 male, 34 female), with a total prize purse for the series being \$14,555. We look forward to continuing to develop sponsorship opportunities for these events as we look ahead to 2026.

The increase in teams is very encouraging and we hope that we can continue to build on these participation numbers for next season.

COMMUNITY YOUTH VOLLEYBALL 2025

Community Youth Volleyball Program

The Community Youth Volleyball (CYV) program is a grassroots program designed to make volleyball programming accessible in communities across Manitoba. Designed to be adaptable, no two CYV programs look exactly the same; we work closely with community contacts, coaches, and families to create programs that fit their unique needs.





CYV is perfect for athletes who want to enjoy the game in a supportive environment without the full commitment of a club season. It's a great option for multi-sport athletes, students who enjoy playing in gym class, or anyone looking for extra touches to build their skills. The program focuses on skill development, emphasizing game-play scenarios and building an encouraging environment.

With customized lesson plans, accessible resources, and ongoing support from the VM office, coaches create age-appropriate sessions that meet athletes where they're at and deliver a positive volleyball experience.

Programs are offered in four age groups (10U, 12U, 14U, and 16U) with both co-ed and gendered options available. To keep participation simple and accessible, Volleyball Manitoba provides affordable pricing for athletes, while coaches receive lesson plans, equipment, and background screening at no cost.

In the past year, we've offered three seasons of CYV: Fall 2024 programs, Winter 2025 programs, and Summer 2025 programs. A key highlight was the Volleyblast tournament in April 2025, where all winter programs were invited to participate in a jamboree-style tournament at Dakota Fieldhouse to use the skills they've developed in a tournament environment. We received overwhelmingly positive feedback about this event.

This past year, Community Youth Volleyball saw a total of 198 participants in the fall, 341 in winter and 77 in summer. Programs numbers are al follows:

Grade 8 Championship / Grade 9 Open

At the end of each school season, Volleyball Manitoba organizes the Grade 8 Championship and Grade 9 Open tournaments.

Grade 8 Division Champions are invited to attend the Grade 8 event, while the Grade 9 event remains an Open competition for any Grade 9 teams interested in attending.

In 2024, the Boys Grade 8 Championship was hosted at Sport Manitoba, and the Girls Grade 8 Championship was hosted in Steinbach, both on November 29th & 30th.

12 Boys teams and 16 Girls teams from across the province competed for the title of Grade 8 Provincial Champions.

On the Girls side, Ness emerged victorious, defeating Holy Ghost in the Final. Charleswood beat Lansdowne in the third-place game.

On the Boys side, Ecole Christine Lesperance defeated Holy Ghost in the championships match, and Meadows West defeated Charleswood for bronze.

The 2024 Grade 9 Open was hosted on November 22nd & 23rd at Dakota Community Centre. 18 Girls Teams and 8 Boys Teams participated, with Sturgeon Heights defeating Selkirk Jr. High in the Girls Final to claim the championship, and SRSS topping MBCI in the Boys Final. Sisler captured Bronze for Girls over SRSS, while Springfield overcame Sargent Park for Boys Bronze.

SUPER-SPIKE 2025

This year marked our 22nd year of Super-Spike, with yet another action-packed weekend! Super-Spike, presented by Corona, was excited to announce that we hit our cap number of volleyball teams at 377 this year before the registration deadline, comprising of just under 3,000 participants. This is a 24 team increase from the previous year.





Super-Spike took place at Maple Grove Rugby Park on July 18th and 19th combining Western Canada's largest outdoor volleyball tournament with a weekend long concert series, all set in a festival atmosphere. This year focused again on dance and pop music, with Canadian stars Preston Pablo and Virginia to Vegas headlining the Birchwood Automotive main stage at the event.

Super-Spike, in its twenty-second year, acts as a significant fundraiser with over \$1.3 million raised to date for local not-for-profits. Funds raised from this year's event supports Volleyball Manitoba as its' main beneficiary and for the first time, the Winnipeg Humane Society.

TECHNICAL LEADERSHIP

Coaching Development

The demand for coach education workshops saw a slight decrease compared to 2024. With changes to the 2025 National Coach Requirements, fewer coaches pursued Advanced Development status. Between December 2024 and May 2025, Volleyball Manitoba delivered four Development Coach workshops, with 48 coaches completing the online sessions.



Coaching club volleyball requires a significant commitment, and Volleyball Manitoba greatly appreciates the dedication of our clubs and coaches in meeting all requirements, including NCCP training, Respect in Sport, and screening protocols. We continue to rank among the top provinces in Canada for coach compliance.

Over the past year, Sport Manitoba Coaching also offered numerous online NCCP courses, which many of our volleyball coaches attended both virtually and in person.

Coaching development will remain a key priority within Volleyball Manitoba, as we develop plans and initiatives to further support and advance coaching in the province.

Dr. Dale Iwanoczko Memorial Volleyball Scholarships

Dale began his volleyball career playing for Lord Selkirk Regional High School and the University of Manitoba Bisons where he was named a five-time All-Canadian, was selected as the CIS/CIAU Most Valuable Player in 1990 and led the Bisons to the national championship title in 1991. He also played on Manitoba's Provincial and Canada Games Teams (85 & 87). He obtained his medical degree from the University of Manitoba, and sadly passed away at the age of 30, after succumbing to Hodgkin's disease, a battle he had fought valiantly for 14 months. Several of Dale's close friends established this scholarship through the Manitoba High Schools Athletic Association and Volleyball Manitoba his honour and memory.

FINANCIAL REPORT & STATEMENTS

Volleyball Manitoba (VM) Finance Committee Report - August 2025

The financial results and position for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025, are presented in the audited financial statements included in this Annual Report.

As reflected in the financial statements and summarized below, members will see how the organization's programming and finances were largely positive, with continued progress in strengthening our reserve fund.

1. Financial Position

As reflected in the **Statement of Financial Position**, the organization recorded an operating deficiency of **\$15,176** during fiscal 2024–25. As a result, unrestricted net assets decreased from **\$337,159** to **\$321,986**.

2. Fiscal 2024–25 Operating Results

Some highlights from the **Statement of Operations** include:

- Operating revenues of **\$1,817,015** and expenses of **\$1,827,548**, resulting in a net loss of **\$15,173**.
- The loss was primarily due to increased Safe Sport investigations and a significant bill from the Office of the Sport Integrity Commissioner (OSIC).
- Revenues from programs such as **Team Manitoba programs**, **Super-Spike**, **and merchandise sales** helped offset the unexpected **\$107,000 OSIC expense**.

3. Looking Ahead to Fiscal 2025-26

In winter 2025, VM staff prepared—and the Board of Directors reviewed and approved—the **2025–26 Operating Budget**.

The budget accounts for several upcoming initiatives and anticipated costs. Overall, projected revenues are \$1,957,284 and expenses are \$1,957,086, for a modest net income of \$198.

Key considerations include:

- Increased expenses tied to Canada Games, Team MB programming, hosting the U14 National Championships, Provincial Championships, and Awards Banquets.
- Hosting Nationals is projected to bring slightly higher income due to one-time funding from Volleyball Canada to offset facility rental costs.
- Transitioning to a new Safe Sport investigator under a subscription model with a more collaborative approach will help control costs, avoiding the unanticipated financial impact experienced in 2024–25.

Opinion

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended March 31, 2025

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Operating as Volleyball Manitoba, the Manitoba Volleyball Association Inc. is a non-profit organization and is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 149 of the Canadian Income Tax Act. The purpose of the organization is to provide quality services and programs that will assist in the promotion, development, and growth of volleyball in Manitoba.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the organization have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and liabilities are at amortized cost unless otherwise noted. Financial assets and liabilities measured at amortized cost consist of cash, accounts receivable, accounts payable and deferred revenue.

It is management's opinion that the organization is not exposed to significant credit, currency, interest rate, liquidity or market risks arising from these financial instruments, unless otherwise noted.

Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost and are being amortized on the straight line basis at the following rates based on estimated useful life, except in the year of acquisition, when one-half of the rate is used:

Computer hardware 2 years Equipment 5 years

The organization reviews captial assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution.

Contributed services and materials

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year. Due to the difficulty of determining the fair market value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

Notes to the Financial Statements For the year ended March 31, 2025

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Unrestricted donations are recognized as revenue in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Externally restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized.

The organization accounts for other revenues using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities as at the date of the financial statements, as well as reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. These estimates are subject to measurement uncertainty, and the effect on the financial statements of changes in such estimates in future periods could be significant.

3. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

The company has a line of credit available to a maximum of \$25,000, repayable on demand with interest at the rate of prime plus 3%. Bank indebtedness is secured by general security agreement providing a floating charge on all assets of the organization.
