5. Board Executive, Staff and Committee Reports

- a. Board President John Olfert announces he is stepping down and not running for a continued Board position. Expresses his satisfaction with the state of the association, that we are financially stable, employees are talented and motivated staff, our membership remains steady, we remain relevant with Volleyball Canada and Sport Manitoba, and acknowledges the work and effort of all the volunteers and stakeholders that deliver volleyball at all levels across the province.
- b. John Blacher, Executive Director, reviews the annual report and the Strategic Plan 2015-2019 and highlights areas of focus moving forward as we look to develop a new plan starting next year for 2020-2024.

2018-19 Volleyball Manitoba Board of Directors

Directors Entering Year 2 (of their 2-year term):

- Andrei Halkewycz (Director) has been a VM Board Member since 2011 and has served on several committees including chairing the Awards & Recognition Committee. He has been involved in Manitoba's volleyball community since the early 1990's as a volunteer with Team Canada. For the past 15 years Andrei has been very involved in volleyball as a certified MVOA official, coaching girl's high school and club teams, and for the past 4 years as a coach and co-club director. Volleyball and its growth in Manitoba is a true passion of his. Andrei is born and raised in Winnipeg, has a degree in Public Relations and has been employed at Halkewycz Law Office as Office Manager since 2010.
- **Doug Ross (Director)** became a board member in 2018. His volleyball background stems back 20 years as a player, coach, club director and official. His experience is extensive, having coached boys and girls in High School and Club, as well as having been a part of coaching Volleyball Manitoba programs. Doug has worked for Fedex Canada for 24 years as a Ramp Operations Trainer and now with the heavyweight department.
- Lorriann Ludwig (Director) is a social worker by profession and parent of two boys currently playing club volleyball. Lorriann was a member of the University of Manitoba Bisons from 1990-1995, trained with the Canadian National Team from 1995-1999 and played overseas in France and Germany from 1995-2001. She has coached school and club volleyball since 2013 and hopes she can assist Volleyball Manitoba in continuing to develop the sport and furthering opportunities in the province. Lorriann became a board member in 2018.
- Roger Labossiere (Treasurer) was elected to the board in 2016, and due to his finance background was subsequently selected as Treasurer by the board and served in this capacity this past year. Roger has coached volleyball at the club, school and provincial team levels since 1987, and has also played in the Winnipeg Men's and Coed Leagues in the past. Roger is currently the CFO for GHY Internationals, has served as the Director of Finance for a marketing agency for 20 years prior to that, and is a member of the Canadian Manufacturers & Exporters (CME) Board of Directors.
- Ryan Munt (Director) is a Commercial Real Estate Agent who has been active in the local volleyball community for over 15 years as a player, coach and volunteer. He has won multiple national championships playing club and beach volleyball, was a member of the University of Manitoba Bisons from 2007-2012, was a member of Canada's Youth & Junior National Teams, and has participated in the Winnipeg Coed and Men's volleyball leagues. He has also coached at the club, university and beach Canada Games levels. Ryan would like to continue his involvement in the sport as a board member helping strengthen the sport across the province. Ryan became a board member in 2018.
- Tim Au (Director) has served as a VM board member since 2012. Tim has been a lifelong active member in Manitoba's volleyball community as he transitioned from an athlete in the high school and club systems into a volunteer and coach. Tim is an NCCP fully certified Performance (Level 3) coach, as well as an NCCP Coaching Course facilitator. Tim is currently an active coach at the grassroots and elite levels. Tim is a lifelong resident of Winnipeg, and a high school Physical Education and Sport Psychology teacher in our community, and is a strong advocate for youth.

Director Representing Affiliated Association

Azad Hosein (Referee Director) has been involved with volleyball since Grade 6 after moving from Trinidad. The transition from outdoor sports to indoor took some adjustments. Azad played all the school sports at Hastings Junior High and Dakota Collegiate up to Grade 11. During the Grade 12 year, he focused on Cricket ultimately making the National Team. While taking his Commerce Degree at the University of Manitoba, he started coaching volleyball at Hastings Junior High. In 1991 Azad took the Level I Referee's course and became an International Referee in 2002. He has refereed over 100 International matches but particularly still enjoys refereeing Age Class and High School volleyball. Azad was selected as the Regional Officials Chairperson in September, 2015.

Directors whose 2-Year Terms are Concluding, and allowing their names to stand again for re-Election:

- **Glen Cook (Director)** has served as a VM board member since 2014, and has been active in Manitoba's volleyball community since the early 1980's. He coached his daughter while she grew up and continues to play in the Winnipeg Men's Volleyball League (WMVL). He has been involved in executive roles with the WMVL since the early 1990's and has been the president for the last 17 years. In the role as president, he arranges over 900 games per



year for WMVL working on all aspects of the administration of the game including; governance, budgets, schedules, contracts, financial management, disciplinary issues etc. Glen is a lifelong resident of Winnipeg, is a professional engineer by training working with Manitoba Hydro for over 30 years.

- Jayme Menzies (President) has served as a VM board director since 2013, taking on the Presidency for the 2018-19 Season. Jayme played five years as a University of Winnipeg varsity volleyball athlete and continues to enjoy Manitoba's senior coed, indoor and beach leagues. This process gave VM a great opportunity for self-reflection and assessment, and offered a road map that we wanted to pursue during this five year period. A summary of the plan includes the following mission, vision and values, as well as strategic priorities as outlined below.

As we get closer to 2020, Volleyball Manitoba will once again be embarking on a process to review accomplishments and shortfalls of this Strategic Plan, while establishing a new plan that will help us determine the goals and objectives we want to pursue as the provincial sport organization for volleyball for 2020-2024.

Our province has a passion for our sport, boasting a rich history of volleyball success at the local, national and international levels that we want to see continue into the future.

- 3) Develop & deliver a comprehensive coach development program, aligned with LTAD.
- 4) Work with the MVOA in implementing the VC Long Term Referee Development Plan.

We continue to review the Strategic Plan on an on-going basis at Board and staff meetings to measure our progress towards our goals and targets.

AGE CLASS CLUB VOLLEYBALL PROGRAMS

2019 Volleyball Manitoba Premier Tournaments

Volleyball Manitoba continued its development of a Premier Tournament Series for club volleyball this past season with the organization of events for all age categories (13u - 18u) over five weekends with 147 teams competing overall. The schedule included the following (team #'s in brackets):

These events help support and enforce the provincial ranking process along with other sanctioned tournaments that are organized by clubs around the province.

Moving Forward: The plan for 2020 will again be to organize events at each of the 13U-18U age categories with the schedule being determined early this fall. The Indoor Competitions Committee is also reviewing the possibility of doing two events for certain categories, but limitations are with available weekends and facilities. We are also looking at the option of making these Premier events mandatory for Provincial Championship rankings, and also the possibility of using other larger club hosted tournaments as part of the 'Premier' ranking series.

2019 Provincial Championships



The 2019 Volleyball Manitoba Provincial Championships were held over two weekends in April & May with events being held in Winnipeg and Brandon. In total, 13 different championships were organized involving 196 teams. Numbers once again warranted a Tier 2 provincial championship to be held in the 14U Girls category. Expanding the tier 2 category for growth and meaningful competition reasons is a focus for VM as we move forward in the coming years.

Moving forward: We will continue attempts to minimize the number of venues, or use clustered facilities, as much as possible, while also addressing appropriate serving and free space, along with the spectator experience. Other notes:

15U Boys – University of Winnipeg Duckworth Centre, Winnipeg 16U Girls – BU Healthy Living Centre & Crocus Plains, Brandon

- Due to Easter falling on the April 19-22 weekend we were forced to compress our events on to two weekends, and some events needed to be spread over 3-days. Further, we were unable to access Red River College over these two weekends so we ended up stretched over a few facilities we wouldn't normally access.
- The use of "power pools" for the preliminary round robin received some mixed feedback and will be a topic of
 consideration for our Competitions Committee to review. We also continue to review and consider number of games
 played on each day of the two day tournaments.
- Continue to strive towards early schedule releases.
- Looking into webcasting options for 2020.

2019 Volleyball Canada National Championships

Volleyball Manitoba would like to congratulate all the Manitoba teams who competed in this year's 2019 Volleyball Canada Championships that were held in multiple locations across the country, mainly as 'cluster' events, scheduled as follows:

Moving forward: As previously determined, VC is moving to a new two year cycle instead of the current three year cycle for Nationals, meaning a Festival Event will be hosted every two years. Volleyball Manitoba is currently working with Tourism Winnipeg to bid on a 2021 event at the RBC Convention Centre Winnipeg.

TEAM MANITOBA VOLLEYBALL PROGRAMS

2019 Team Manitoba Junior, Youth & Select Programs

Each year, Volleyball Manitoba contributes to the continued development of our performance athletes by running Provincial Teams for 15U – 18U athletes. The goal of these programs is to provide our top athletes with a high-level development opportunity both on and off the court. They receive coaching from some of Manitoba's best coaches, play with and against the best athletes from across Manitoba & Canada in their respective age category, get an opportunity to represent their province on Team Toba, build lifelong friendships, and build life skills that will benefit them in the future.

This summer, Volleyball Manitoba selected players for the **2019 Team Manitoba Junior** (2001, 2002 or later), **Youth** (2002, 2003 or later) and **Select** (2003, 2004 or later) programs. The selection camps wrapped up on June 2 with players being selected for the programs, plus several additional athletes chosen to be a part of provincial training programs. The teams trained this summer out of the Canada Games Sport for Life Centre and Dakota Community Centre, with the Junior Teams competing in the 2019 US High Performance Championship in Ft. Lauderdale, FL from July 18-22 and the Youth & Select Teams competing in the Canada Cup in Halifax, NS, from July 16th-21st.

2019 Western Canada Summer Games Programs

The 2019 Western Canada Summer Games were held in Swift Current, SK from August 9th-18th (Beach Volleyball Aug 9th-13th, Indoor Volleyball Aug 13th-18th).

Athletes were selected from the Junior, Youth & Select teams to compose the WCSG Indoor teams, with an eye on the 2021 Canada Games eligible group. The WCSG Indoor teams trained from late July through to their departure date to the games. The WCSG Beach teams were selected from a training group through a qualification tournament. 6 Girls teams and 5 Boys teams competed to earn the 2 spots per gender at the games.

Our Indoor Girls team finished 1st.

Our Indoor Boys team finished 2nd.

Our Beach Girls teams finished 1st and 2nd.

Our Beach Boys teams finished $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ and $\mathbf{4}^{th}.$

2019 Team Manitoba Girls Select and Boys Future Select (athletes born in 2004-2007)

2019 once again saw a Provincial level training program to introduce younger players to the skills and concepts used by the Select, Youth and Junior teams. The goal of the program is an earlier introduction to Provincial level programming to help us to build a stronger program as well as connect earlier with this age group who could be among be the next group of Canada Games indoor athletes. This program was delivered over 3 days from July 3-5 involving a full day training schedule at Dakota Community Centre with the participation of over 30 girls and 24 boys. The program was led by Gui Ossig and Shane Smith.



Moving forward: The Provincial Performance Committee will continue to review the summer programs with the goal to develop and deliver the best programs possible, as we look short term towards the 2021 Canada Games, and long term towards future games and ultimately placing more athletes on national team programs.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL PROGRAMS

2019 High School Beach Volleyball Championships

As part of a multi-year transition plan, 2019 saw Volleyball Manitoba host the High School Beach Volleyball Championships for the first time, taking over from Stephen Densmore. Steve started the tournament in 2000 and it has grown to host over 300 teams annually.

This season the tournament was hosted on 22 courts at Sargent Park Beach Volleyball Centre and Melrose Park Community Centre on Friday, May 24th and Saturday, May 25th. We had 329 teams participate across 4 divisions (60 Jr. Boys teams, 133 Jr. Girls teams, 65 Sr. Boys teams and 71 Sr. Girls teams). Champions and Consolation winners can be found in <u>Appendix F</u>.

2019 Beach Volleyball Leagues

The 2019 Summer Series Beach Volleyball League, which included Adult and Youth 2's, continues to operate out of the Sargent Park Beach Volleyball Centre utilizing eight-to-ten courts Monday through Thursday evenings, from early June through early August. Additionally, in partnership with Maple Grove Rugby Park and Super-Spike, VM helped construct 2 additional courts at Maple Grove. As part of the partnership VM assumed the operation of beach volleyball leagues operating out of Maple Grove for 2019 and beyond, running eight courts Monday through Thursday evenings from early June through early August.

A separate league was also organized this past season by Beach Bandits out of Melrose Park CC, affiliating itself with Volleyball Manitoba through membership. Additionally, for the first time the Winkler Beach Volleyball League became a member league with Volleyball Manitoba.

For 2019 the youth league also implemented a coaching/training component at the start of the season and timed matches, as well as an earlier end to the season. The 2019 leagues also followed this model and feedback continues to be positive.

Moving forward: We will continue to review the delivery of our beach leagues for 2020 and beyond. Feedback has been mostly positive to our current league formats, so we plan to continue with this league model going forward while also looking for ways to improve the participant experience.



2019 Beach Volleyball Tournaments

In 2019, in an effort to establish a bigger marquee beach event, Volleyball Manitoba partnered with the AVP Beach Volleyball Tour to deliver **AVP First (14U - 18U)** and **AVP Next (Adult Open)** Beach Tournaments. Unfortunately, due to changes in the AVP delivery structure we were unable to host these AVP branded tournaments in 2019. Instead we delivered our own Volleyball Manitoba Premier Events on July 20 (Youth) and July 21 (Adult), and while they were well received by participants, we will be investigating bringing back the AVP branding for 2020.

Volleyball Manitoba also supported or coordinated various other tournaments throughout the season, including coordinating the Nikki Redekop Memorial Tournament (for the first time in several years) in June and providing support for the Stefan Savoie Memorial Tournament in July. Both events were hosted at Sargent Park and raised funds for their respective memorial scholarship programs. Additionally, we lent our support to the Jr. High Beach Challenge in early June, and the Inaugural Players Invitational tournament on August Long weekend at Grand Beach.

Moving forward: We will continue to review our delivery of beach tournaments for 2020 and beyond, including an earlier release of our tournament schedule as well as ensuring conflict-free event dates.

Super-Spike 2019

Super-Spike combines Western Canada's largest outdoor volleyball tournament with a weekend-long concert series, all set in a festival atmosphere, with the event having taken place on Friday, July 26th and Saturday, July 27th at Maple Grove Rugby Park. It was the third year of the event being organized through Volleyball Manitoba (previously through the Winnipeg-based, Team Canada office).



Ultimate was featured at Super-Spike for the second year to go along with the outdoor volleyball event. Kardinal Offishall and Delaney Jane were this year's Saturday night headliner artists. We saw a significant decrease in participant attendance for the second consecutive year, dropping to 382 (370 Volleyball and 12 Ultimate) from 425 (402 Volleyball and 23 Ultimate) in 2018, and 465 in 2017.



Moving Forward: The Super-Spike organizing committee will continue to review the event, trying to gain a better understanding of the decrease in participation. Super-Spike is intended in part to provide revenue for Volleyball Manitoba operations, along with annual contributions to local charities, and adjustments in the planning will need to be made to manage expenses in line with lower participation numbers as well as increasing revenue opportunities for next year.

2019 Beach Volleyball Provincial Championships

Manitoba's Beach Volleyball Provincial Champions were crowned over the August 9-10 weekend Sargent Park Beach Volleyball Centre, with 21 teams in four categories competing. We were down significantly from 48 teams across 8 categories in 2018, due in part we believe to the Western Canada Summer Games taking place over this same weekend. We will be considering changes to the date of the Championships for 2020 to encourage additional participation.

We would like to thank all the teams who participated in the 2019 Championships and we hope to see everyone back next year!

2018 Junior High Challenge / Grade 9 Open

At the end of each school season, Volleyball Manitoba has organized the Junior High Challenge and Grade 9 Open events. These events have not historically been official championships as they have been open to all teams for participation. Beginning in 2017 however, working with divisional Phys Ed Supervisors the Grade 8 event was re-structured as a championship tournament involving winning teams from school divisions in Winnipeg and around the province. Also, for the first time in many years all four tournaments were held, with 35 teams in total involved.

Initiation Programs

Volleyball Manitoba continues to deliver and support early initiation programming, such as at the 12U or Grades 5-7 levels. A Grades 5-7 programs was delivered in the fall of 2018 at the Sport for Life Centre with approximately 24 young volleyball players and a similar program was delivered in Selkirk in March & April 2019 with 24 athletes.

The format of these programs uses the Volleyball Canada recommended 4 on 4 model with smaller badminton sized courts and nets. The programs fit well at the beginning of the ice sports seasons (Sept-Oct) and between the conclusion of winter ice sports and the beginning of soccer season (April/May).

Moving forward: This coming season we will again be looking at fall & spring programs and we would also like to see the program expand to other locations across the province with a similar format.

2018 Winter Youth League becomes 2019 Team VM

For the 2018 season, Volleyball Manitoba was pleased to offer a new program for athletes looking to play volleyball in the winter. The Winter Youth Volleyball League was created to provide skill instruction and game play opportunities to players who are newer to the game or have played school volleyball but may not be playing club volleyball. Divisions included a Grade 6/7 category (born in 2006/07) and a Grade 8/9 category (born in 2004/05).

For the 2019 season, this league evolved into Team VM, a low-barriers Train-and-Play program aimed at athletes who wanted to play volleyball but couldn't/didn't want to commit to a full time Club program. In it's first season Team VM hosted a 13U Girls team, two 14U Girls teams, two 15U Girls teams, a 16U Girls team, a 13U Boys team and a 15U Boys team. Teams trained twice a week at the Canada Games Sport For Life Centre and participated in the VM Premier Tournaments and Provincial Championships. In total 84 athletes participated across the 8 teams.



Adult Senior Volleyball

Several volleyball leagues exist throughout the province that provide playing opportunities for adults once they are done with school, age class or post-secondary levels of our sport. This is important as we strive to promote active for life involvement in volleyball. With only the Winnipeg Men's Volleyball League (WMVL) as indoor adult members of Volleyball Manitoba (in addition to beach leagues), efforts continue to gain membership from other leagues and we continue to work on identifying and providing benefits and services that our adult members may desire in order for them to consider affiliating themselves as members of our association.

Sitting Volleyball

Working with Manitoba Adaptive Sport and Leisure and Limb Loss Manitoba, Volleyball Manitoba organized a 'Try-It Sitting Volleyball' session on Sunday, February 3rd at the Sport for Life Centre. The session was open to para and able bodied athletes and approximately 8 participants attended to learn more and try out the game.

We look forward to continuing to work with Limb Loss Manitoba, Manitoba Adaptive Sport & Leisure and other groups to promote and grow the game of sitting volleyball.





TECHNICAL LEADERSHIP

Coaching Clinics & Development

The Volleyball Canada Development (former level 1) and Advanced Development (former level 2) coach levels have now been fully implemented since 2017. These levels remain the responsibility of the Provincial Associations. The Performance coach level (former level 3) has shifted to become the responsibility of Volleyball Canada. Candidates are nominated or can apply to attend the Performance coach workshops currently offered in the summers by Volleyball Canada.



Volleyball Manitoba is also proud to support other annual clinics including the **BU Volleyball Coaches Summit** that took place on Thursday, September 7, 2018 (this year's 2019 clinic is scheduled for Thursday, September 26), along with the **Volleyball Coaching Seminar** that was held on Friday, September 7 at the University of Winnipeg (this year on Friday, September 6 in conjunction with the NORCECA Championship).

Moving Forward: Volleyball Manitoba will begin this fall to update our Learning Facilitators and train Evaluators. We will also be confirming early this fall a schedule of Development and Advanced Development workshops for this fall, winter and spring. We will also start communicating with coaches this year about the Continuing Education credits they will need in the coming years to maintain existing certification levels.

Coach Screening Compliance & Certification Requirements

Volleyball Manitoba maintains and requires certain standards for coaches of club volleyball teams, in line with Volleyball Canada and Sport Manitoba. These include certification expectations with NCCP, Respect in Sport and Screening requirements. Volleyball Manitoba would like to once again acknowledge and thank all of the clubs for their efforts this past season with encouraging and ensuring that coaches and directors meet the required screening and certification requirements.

Moving Forward: Volleyball Manitoba will be continuing to enforce these screening and certification requirements, and clubs are encouraged to continue to be pro-active this coming year with ensuring coaches achieve full compliance at the start of the season.



Referee Development Report

We are slowly becoming paperless in our assigning and communication with referees. Technology has made our association more efficient. In the last 5 years, we have only had 2 missed assignments due to a breakdown in communication. In the last 5 years, we have assigned over 25,000 matches.

Our beach referees will be forming their own association in Manitoba. This will allow the program to be overseen by beach referees who are active in the day-to-day activities. The new association's name is BRAM. My next meeting with the new group will be focused on who they report to, Volleyball Manitoba or Volleyball Canada.

Indoor volleyball has become a year round sport in Manitoba. There are senior leagues that use us in the summer months as well as some age class camps that require referees.

Highlights for the 2018-19 season:

- Taras Ilkiw was inducted into the Manitoba Volleyball Hall of Fame.
- Manitoba was awarded the CIS Men's Championships for March 2020.
- Manitoba will be hosting a NORCECA Mens Championship in September 2019.

A challenge for the MVOA is attracting referees to promote to the National level. Most referees are discouraged by the new system for advancing to the International level and do not want to add the stress of officiating the university volleyball if there is little or no hope of advancing to Level V.

The MVOA Executive, Scott Borys, and John Blacher have provided the necessary support for us to have a successful year.

Moving forward: Continue to work with the MVOA on recruitment, retention and development of referees throughout Manitoba.

FINANCIAL REPORT & STATEMENTS

Volleyball Manitoba (VM) Finance Committee Report – September, 2019 Submitted by Roger Labossiere, Board Treasurer & Chair Finance Committee

Financial results and position for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2019 are presented in the audited financial statements included in this Annual Report.

As reflected in the financial statements and this brief report, results are consistent with the annual approved budget, and represent the work and activity of VM for fiscal 2019 (April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019).

In summary;

1. <u>Financial Position</u>. As reflected on the Statement of Financial Position, given an operating surplus of \$9,567 during fiscal 2019, Unrestricted Net Assets changed from \$45,407 to \$54,974.

While not having a specific target or mandate to accumulate a reserve, VM's Board of Directors is comfortable with this level of excess cash to manage seasonal and year-to-year programming and cashflow fluctuations experienced by VM.

2. Fiscal 2019 Operating Results.

The Statement of Operations reflects several hi-lights for VM's fiscal 2019 activity. These include:

- Annual operating surplus was right on budget. Actual was \$9,567 (after amortization) compared to budget of \$10,700.
- Overall receipts from Sport Manitoba Grants were consistent with budget of \$158,750.
- Other Grants/Funders includes \$29,000 from Canada Games legacy grant for beach and indoor equipment.
- Membership revenues were slightly down (actual \$127,655 vs budget \$130,500).
- Provincial Team revenues of \$205,560 were higher than budgeted of \$165,500 which helped offset some of the costs associated with these programs.
- Superspike revenue of \$403,065 less expenses of \$386,431 added a net \$16,634 to Volleyball Manitoba
 programming, however this was well short of our budget of \$43,000 (net). This was a result of lower registration,
 sponsorship and beer garden sales.
- Other revenue included Sale of merchandise of \$50,174 vs budget of \$15,000 (associated costs were \$25,648 vs budget of \$5,000).
- 3. <u>Looking Forward to Fiscal 2020</u>. During the spring of 2019, VM staff prepared, and the Board of Directors reviewed and approved the fiscal 2020 Operating Budget.

The budget quantifies a number of realities and initiatives. Overall, we are budgeting for a modest surplus of \$7,100. Below is a detailed Statement of Operations which reflects consistent programming similar to F2019.
