- Introduced Activity Messenger (via Sport Manitoba).
- Grad All-Star Games moved to University of Winnipeg; Awards Banquet held at RBC Convention Centre.
- Grade 8/9 Championships financial strain addressed by moving to a host school model (with free entry for host schools). Still seeking boys' hosts.

President's Report

It is my pleasure to present the 2026 Board President's Report on behalf of the Volleyball Manitoba Board of Directors.

The past year has been one of significant momentum and continued growth for volleyball in Manitoba. Across our programs and competitive pathways, participation continues to increase, reflecting the strength of our sport and the dedication of the athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, clubs and families who make our volleyball community possible.

As a Board, our responsibility is to ensure that Volleyball Manitoba is positioned not only to respond to this growth, but to lead it thoughtfully and sustainably. This means providing strong governance and oversight, supporting our staff, managing risk, and ensuring that the organization remains focused on its long-term mission and strategic priorities.

A key priority for the Board this year has been providing governance and strategic oversight as Volleyball Manitoba prepares for its next stage of development. In collaboration with staff, the organization is developing a new strategic plan to guide Volleyball Manitoba beginning in 2027. The Board's role is to provide direction and oversight throughout this process, ensuring that the plan reflects the organization's mandate, establishes clear strategic priorities, and positions Volleyball Manitoba for long-term sustainability and success.

The Board has also continued to focus on its own effectiveness and governance capacity. As the organization evolves, it is important that the Board's composition and collective skill set evolve with it. Effective governance requires a strong balance of skills, experience, perspectives, and backgrounds to support thoughtful decision-making, appropriate oversight, and accountability.

As we move into the next strategic planning cycle, the Board remains committed to strengthening its governance practices and ensuring that its composition reflects a diversity of perspectives and experiences, including meaningful representation of women and communities across Manitoba. A strong and diverse Board enhances our ability to provide effective oversight, support organizational leadership, and make informed decisions in the best interests of Volleyball Manitoba and the broader volleyball community.

Facility access remains one of the most significant challenges facing the continued growth of volleyball in Manitoba. Increasing participation is placing greater pressure on the limited availability of multi-court facilities, while rising facility costs continue to affect the delivery of competitions and programs. The Board recognizes that addressing this challenge will require continued collaboration with Sport Manitoba, schools, municipalities, facility operators and other partners.

The Board also recognizes the importance of creating a strong and sustainable environment for athletes, coaches and officials. Volleyball Manitoba's relationship with the Manitoba Volleyball Officials Association is an excellent example of the collaborative approach required to strengthen our sport. Our organizations continue to support one another through communication, education, recruitment and development, recognizing the essential role officials play within the volleyball community.

Safe Sport also remains a fundamental responsibility of the organization. The Board supports Volleyball Manitoba's continued work with Sport Manitoba and ITP Sport to ensure that appropriate processes are in place to respond to concerns, educate participants and fulfill our responsibilities under Manitoba's Protecting Youth in Sport Act. Creating an environment where athletes feel safe, respected and supported must remain at the center of everything we do.

Volleyball Manitoba is finally in a very strong financial position mostly due to some strong events and some excellent fiscal management decisions by Coralee. This position will show benefits in the near future the first of which will be an update to the website which was desperately needed.

As I reflect on this year, I want to sincerely thank the staff of Volleyball Manitoba for their tireless efforts and countless hours behind the scenes—your commitment does not go unnoticed. I am equally grateful to the Volleyball Manitoba Board and committee members who generously volunteer their time and expertise to strengthen and grow our sport. Your dedication is deeply valued and appreciated.

Executive Director's Report

The 2025–2026 season was a year of exceptional growth, activity and organizational development for Volleyball Manitoba. Across our competitive, developmental and community programs, participation continued to increase, while our events reached new levels and our organization continued to build the capacity needed to support a growing volleyball community.

The scale of volleyball in Manitoba continues to expand. This year, 272 club teams competed at the Club Volleyball Provincial Championships, while 274 beach teams participated in the Beach League. Our Community Youth Programs also welcomed 716 participants, demonstrating the growing demand for accessible opportunities to introduce young people to volleyball.

Club Volleyball

Club Volleyball continues to be one of the largest components of Manitoba's volleyball system. Nearly 60 clubs and more than 270 teams participate annually across the 13U–18U age categories.

The club season requires significant operational capacity from the Volleyball Manitoba team, from registration and compliance through competition scheduling, tournaments and Provincial Championships. This past season provided valuable opportunities to evaluate our processes and identify improvements for the coming year. We have been working with other provincial and territorial volleyball organizations to share ideas and develop best practices, while also incorporating feedback from our clubs, coaches and families.

As facility costs and other event expenses continue to increase, we are also reviewing how we can improve the competition environment while remaining financially responsible and sustainable.

Team Manitoba and Athlete Development

Team Manitoba had a successful season, with 232 athletes participating across the White, Black and Gold programs.

We were particularly pleased to expand interprovincial competition opportunities for our athletes. Thirty-two Team Manitoba Black athletes travelled to Regina to participate in a new competition opportunity developed in partnership with Volleyball Saskatchewan. Our Gold teams competed at Canada Cup, where the 17U Boys team captured a gold medal.

Creating more meaningful competition opportunities for Manitoba athletes remains an important part of our athlete pathway. As we look ahead, we will continue to explore regional and interprovincial opportunities that allow our athletes to compete against strong opposition while gaining valuable experience.

Community and Grassroots Volleyball

Expanding access to volleyball beyond Winnipeg remains a key organizational priority. This year, Volleyball Manitoba delivered programming in 16 communities across Manitoba, helping bring volleyball opportunities to athletes and coaches outside the province's largest urban centre.

One of the greatest challenges in expanding this work is recruiting qualified coaches who are able and willing to travel to rural and remote communities. In the coming year, we will focus on developing a stronger network of coaches who can deliver skill development, coach education and grassroots programming throughout the province.

Our Community Youth Programs also continued to provide important entry points into the sport, with 716 participants taking part this year.

School Competitions

Volleyball Manitoba continued to support school-based volleyball through several events, including the Grade 8 and Grade 9 Opens, High School Beach Open and Grad All-Star events. These programs provide athletes with additional opportunities to compete while strengthening the connection between school volleyball and the broader volleyball pathway.

Safe Sport

Safe Sport continues to be an important and ongoing area of work for Volleyball Manitoba.

We work closely with ITP Sport, our independent third-party investigator, to ensure that concerns are directed through an appropriate and independent process. During the club season, Volleyball Manitoba staff dedicate significant time to listening to concerns related to coaching, club processes and relationships both on and off the court.

To support participants, we have established a triage process to help individuals understand where their concern should be directed and whether it may constitute a Safe Sport complaint, a club-level matter or another type of concern. We also require clubs to establish and communicate clear internal processes so that athletes and families understand where they can seek assistance.

The implementation of Manitoba's Protecting Youth in Sport Act has added further responsibilities for sport organizations. Volleyball Manitoba continues to work closely with Sport Manitoba and ITP Sport to ensure that our processes align with the legislation and that clubs and participants understand their responsibilities.

Education remains an important part of this work. Volleyball Manitoba has offered Safe Sport webinars and continues to work toward helping our community better understand the distinction between a legitimate Safe Sport concern, a complaint that should be addressed through another process, and general dissatisfaction or disagreement.

Our transition from OSIC to ITP Sport has also resulted in a more efficient investigation process and significantly reduced costs. In the previous fiscal year, Volleyball Manitoba incurred approximately \$30,000 in OSIC-related costs. In the current fiscal year, our ITP Sport subscription was just over \$10,000, representing a substantial improvement in financial sustainability while maintaining access to an independent third-party process.

Officials

Volleyball Manitoba is proud of its strong and collaborative relationship with the Manitoba Volleyball Officials Association (MVOA). Our organizations work closely together to support the continued growth and development of volleyball in Manitoba, recognizing the essential role officials play in delivering safe, fair and high-quality competition.

Throughout the year, Volleyball Manitoba and the MVOA have continued to work collaboratively. This strong partnership is an important part of the success of volleyball across the province, and we look forward to continuing to work together to strengthen officiating and create positive experiences for athletes, coaches and clubs.

Events and Recognition

Our events continue to provide important opportunities for athletes while also contributing to the visibility and sustainability of volleyball in Manitoba.

A highlight of the year was our Hall of Fame and Annual Awards event, which welcomed more than 400 attendees. The event provided an opportunity to recognize the outstanding contributions and achievements of individuals who have helped build and strengthen volleyball in Manitoba.

Our continued growth in events and participation also reinforces the importance of investing in strong systems, facilities, staff capacity and volunteer support to ensure that we can meet the needs of our membership.

Organizational Development

The growth of our programs and events has required Volleyball Manitoba to continue evolving as an organization. Changes to our staffing structure this year have strengthened collaboration, increased capacity and allowed us to approach our work in new ways.

This was particularly evident during an exceptionally busy competition season. While the increased activity brought challenges, it also provided valuable learning opportunities. We have taken time to evaluate what worked well, where improvements are required and how we can strengthen our systems and processes moving forward.

Our goal is not simply to manage growth, but to build an organization capable of sustaining it.

Financial Sustainability

Volleyball Manitoba enters the next phase of its development from a stronger financial position. Successful events, continued participation growth and careful financial management have provided the organization with greater capacity to invest in its future.

This stronger financial foundation will allow us to make strategic investments in areas that have been identified as priorities, including technology modernization and improvements to the organization's digital infrastructure. These investments are intended to improve the experience of our members and increase the efficiency of our operations.

Financial sustainability will remain an important consideration as we balance increased demand for programming with rising facility, event and operational costs.

Looking Ahead

Volleyball Manitoba is currently developing a new strategic plan that will guide our direction beginning in 2027. The plan is focused on growth, development and creating greater opportunities for Manitobans to participate in and experience volleyball.

Our strategic priorities are organized into three levels:

Tier 1 — Core Strategic Priorities

- Facility Development and Access
- Athlete Pathway Development
- Coach Education and Support
- High Performance Programming

Tier 2 — Growth and Development

- Community and Grassroots Growth
- Club Development
- Safe Sport
- Equity, Diversity and Inclusion

Tier 3 — Organizational Capacity

- Technology Modernization
- Revenue Generation
- Marketing and Brand Growth
- Volunteer Recruitment and Retention

These priorities reflect both the opportunities and challenges facing volleyball in Manitoba. We want to expand access to the sport while also strengthening the pathways available to athletes and coaches who want to pursue higher levels of excellence.

Among our priorities will be increasing community programming, expanding support for rural and remote communities, developing opportunities for coaches to travel throughout Manitoba, exploring a regional excellence program and creating additional interprovincial competition opportunities for Team Manitoba athletes.

We are also in the middle of a website development project, creating a brand new website that will be user friendly, and help people to find important information easily and efficiently.

We are entering this next chapter with considerable momentum. The growth of volleyball in Manitoba is being driven by athletes, families, coaches, officials, volunteers, clubs and communities across the province. Our responsibility at Volleyball Manitoba is to ensure that our organization, systems and resources grow alongside them.

I am grateful to our staff for their dedication and professionalism throughout another exceptionally busy year. I also extend my sincere appreciation to our Board, volunteers, coaches, officials, clubs, partners and, most importantly, our athletes and families.

Together, we are building a stronger, more accessible and more ambitious future for volleyball in Manitoba.

Thanks in large part to significant staff efforts we did reach 100% screening compliance among coaches at Provincial Championships.

2026 Club Provincial Championships

The Volleyball Manitoba 2026 Club Provincial Championships were held over four weekends in April & May with events being held in Winnipeg, Niverville, Brandon, & Steinbach (and surrounding area). In total, 12 different championships were organized involving 272 teams.

Team Check-In procedures continued to be enforced at our Provincial Championships to help ensure that only eligible coaches and players were in attendance. This is an important step in enforcing our Coach Screening and Certification policies.

Our continued growth is putting strain on our event hosting with almost all events now requiring multiple venues, and our largest event requiring 4 venues to accommodate all of the teams.

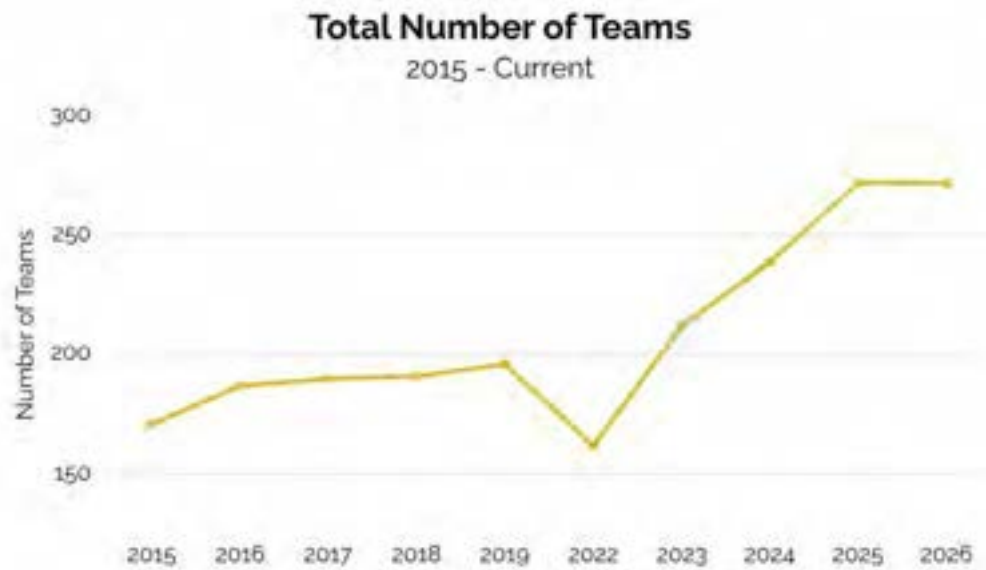


Figure 1: Total number of teams participating in Provincial Championships (2015 – 2026)

The number of teams steadily increased from 2015 – 2019, followed by a sharp dip in 2022, due to COVID-19. Growth resumed strongly from 2023 onward, reaching the highest level in 2025 and 2026. This trend reflects a temporary disruption and a significant recovery.

2026 Volleyball Canada National Championships

Volleyball Canada wrapped up the 2026 Nationals in May, as they saw an increase of attendance this year to 1,987 teams, resulting in the largest turnout in Nationals history with 319 more teams than in 2025. These events were spread over 5 weeks in 5 cities, including Ottawa, Moncton, Edmonton, Mississauga, and Calgary.

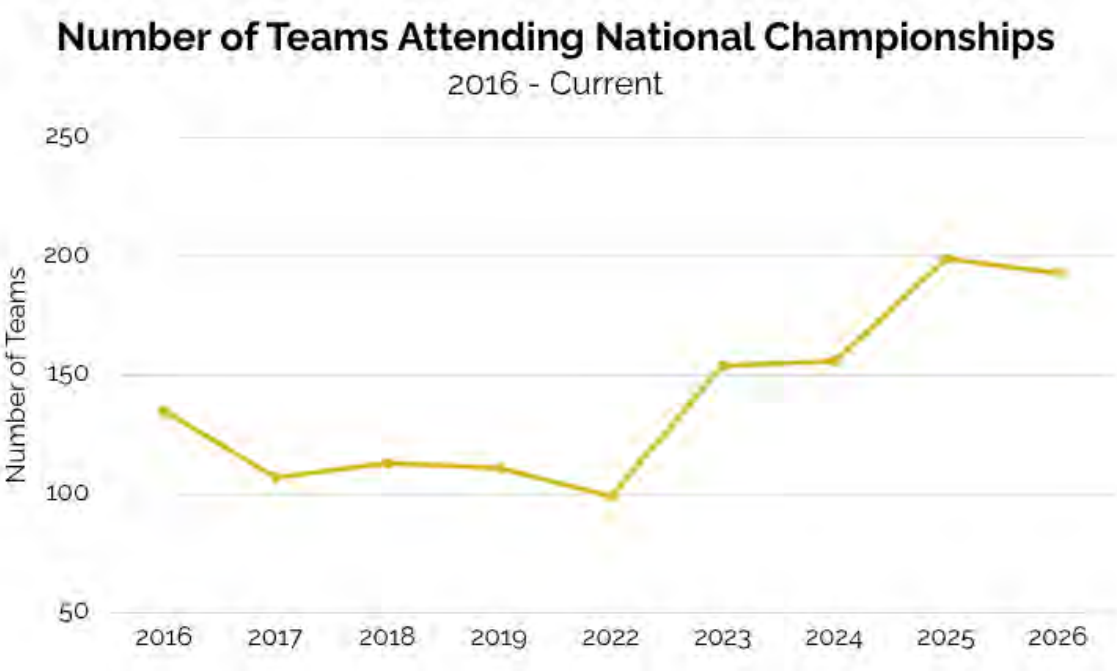


Figure 2: Total number of teams participating in National Champions (2016 – 2025)

TEAM MANITOBA PROGRAMS 2026

Our Team Manitoba program was once again a success, offering roughly 200 athletes a high-performance development opportunity. The Gold, Black, and White framework supports athlete growth across a wide range of ages, providing a positive and competitive environment where athletes can progress at their own pace, whether competing within Manitoba or on the national stage at the Canada Cup.

2026 Team Manitoba Black & White Programs

Serving as the first step in the provincial team pathway, Team Manitoba White focused on developing 13U and 14U athletes' understanding of the game while encouraging them to explore different positions and build the skills needed to perform in each. The program emphasized growth, versatility, and a positive learning environment, helping athletes lay a strong foundation for future success at higher levels of competition. The boys' program fielded 38 athletes, and the girls' program fielded 46 athletes.

Team Manitoba Black serves as the second stage in the provincial team pathway, emphasizing skill refinement, system development, and competition exposure for 14U and 15U athletes. Additionally, athletes begin to specialize in specific positions or continue exploring different roles. The boys' program fielded 41 athletes, and the girls' program fielded 51 athletes.

New this year, 16 of the top 15U Manitoba athletes were selected out of the Team Manitoba Black training pool to go to Regina from July 15-17 to further develop their skills in a training/exhibition game series with Team Sask's 15U Future Selects program.

Tryouts for the Team Manitoba White & Black programs took place in June, and selected athletes trained throughout the month of July. Their seasons concluded with competing at the 2026 Manitoba Cup, held July 24-25 in Winnipeg, where programs divided into teams within their own program and competed against one another in a tournament-style competition. Athletes showcased their progress made over the summer and gained valuable competitive experience.

2026 Canada Cup

Canada Cup was held in Regina, Saskatchewan at the Bungee International Trade Centre from July 21–26, 2026. The tournament brought Canada's next generation of high-performance athletes to compete for their home province/territory in a national championship, and for the first time, the tournament included an All Nations Men's and Women's Team. There were two divisions at the tournament: the White Division and the Red Division. Competition ran from Wednesday to Sunday, with each team playing one to two best-of-five matches daily. Team Manitoba had 63 participants (55 athletes and 8 coaches) from the Gold Program, sending a total of four teams. Manitoba's teams demonstrated growth, resilience, and a competitive spirit, leaving a strong impression on the national stage. In the White Division, the 17U Girls Team finished 11th overall, while the 17U Boys Team had an impressive 1st place finish. In the Red Division, the 18U Boys Team finished 7th and the 18U Girls Team Finished 8th.

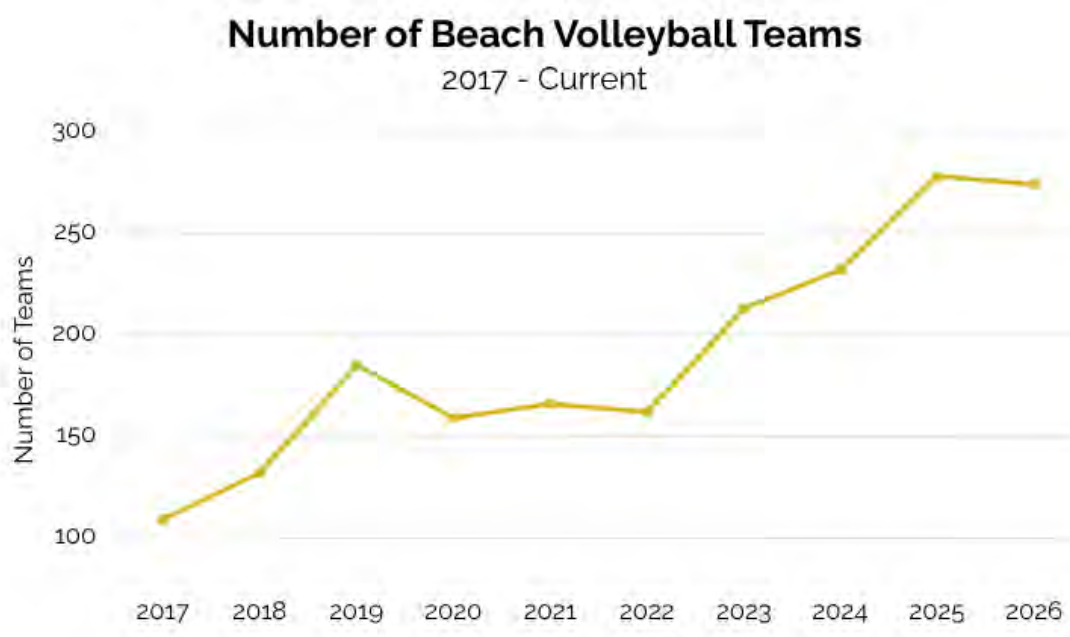


Figure 3: Number of Beach Volleyball Teams (2017 – 2026)

COMMUNITY YOUTH VOLLEYBALL 2026

Community Youth Volleyball Program

The Community Youth Volleyball (CYV) program is a grassroots program designed to make volleyball programming accessible in communities across Manitoba. Designed to be adaptable, no two CYV programs look exactly the same; we work closely with community contacts, coaches, and families to create programs that fit their unique needs.



CYV is perfect for athletes who want to enjoy the game in a supportive environment without the full commitment of a club season. It's a great option for multi-sport athletes, students who enjoy playing in gym class, or anyone looking for extra touches to build their skills. The program focuses on skill development, emphasizing game-play scenarios and building an encouraging environment.

With customized lesson plans, accessible resources, and ongoing support from the VM office, coaches create age-appropriate sessions that meet athletes where they're at and deliver a positive volleyball experience.

Programs are offered in four age groups (10U, 12U, 14U, and 16U) with both co-ed and gendered options available. To keep participation simple and accessible, Volleyball Manitoba provides affordable pricing for athletes, while coaches receive lesson plans, equipment, and background screening at no cost.

In the past year, we've offered three seasons of CYV: Fall 2025 programs, Winter 2026 programs, and Summer 2026 programs. A key highlight was the Volleyblast tournament in April 2026, where all winter programs were invited to participate in a jamboree-style tournament at Dakota Fieldhouse to use the skills they've developed in a tournament environment. We received overwhelmingly positive feedback about this event.

This past year, Community Youth Volleyball saw a total of 336 participants in the fall, 334 in winter and 46 in summer. Programs numbers are as follows:

ADDITIONAL PROGRAMS 2026

Grade 8 Championship / Grade 9 Open

At the end of each school season, Volleyball Manitoba organizes the Grade 8 Championship and Grade 9 Open tournaments.

In 2025, the Boys Grade 8 Championship was hosted at Garden City Collegiate, and the **Girls Grade 8 Championship** was hosted at Maples Collegiate, both on November 28th & 29th. 12 Boys teams and 12 Girls teams from across the province competed for the title of Grade 8 Provincial Champions.

On the Boys side, Leila North Lions defeated the Crescentview Cobras in the championships match, and Major Pratt Trojans defeated Sainte-Agathe Bouledogues for bronze. On the Girls side, Clearspring Trailblazers emerged victorious, defeating Leila North Lions in the Final. Edward Schreyer Barons beat Grant Park Pirates in the third-place game.

The 2025 Grade 9 Boys Open was hosted on November 28th & 29th at Tec Voc High School and the **Grade 9 Girls Open** was hosted on November 28th & 29th at Maples Collegiate. 10 Boys Teams and 16 Girls Teams participated, with Steinbach Sabres defeating Gabrielle-Roy in the Boys Final to claim the championship, and Selkirk Royals defeating St. Mary's Flames in the Girls Final. Garden City Gophers captured Bronze for Boys over Dakota Lancers, while Steinbach Sabres overcame Kelvin Clippers for Girls Bronze.

Over these 4 events, 600+ athletes and 100+ coaches participated. We are excited to continue partnering with host schools to keep costs low for all teams.

SUPER-SPIKE 2026

Super-Spike 2026 was another record-setting year for Volleyball Manitoba, reinforcing its position as Western Canada's largest outdoor volleyball tournament. Held July 17-18 at Maple Grove Rugby Park, the event reached a record 400 teams, 23 more than the previous year, selling out before the registration deadline.

Volleyball Manitoba plays a key leadership role in delivering Super-Spike, with our staff working closely with the Organizing Committee, volunteers, sponsors and partners to oversee the tournament, registration, competition, officiating and event operations.



Super-Spike is an important event for Volleyball Manitoba, providing a significant source of revenue that supports our programs, athlete development, competitions and services to the volleyball community. It also provides an opportunity to showcase volleyball in Manitoba, attract teams and spectators from across Western Canada, and strengthen Manitoba's reputation as a destination for volleyball.

Beyond the courts, Super-Spike continued its festival atmosphere with a weekend-long concert series featuring Canadian artists FeFe Dobson and Tyler Shaw. The combination of volleyball, entertainment and community makes Super-Spike a signature event for Manitoba and an important part of Volleyball Manitoba's continued growth and success.

TECHNICAL LEADERSHIP

Coaching Development

The demand for coach education workshops saw a slight increase compared to 2025.

Between October 2025 and March 2026, Volleyball Manitoba delivered five Development Coach workshops, with 57 coaches completing the online sessions.

Coaching club volleyball requires a significant commitment, and Volleyball Manitoba greatly appreciates the dedication of our clubs and coaches in meeting all requirements, including NCCP training, Respect in Sport, and screening protocols. We continue to rank among the top provinces in Canada for coach compliance.

Over the past year, Sport Manitoba Coaching also offered numerous online NCCP courses, which many of our volleyball coaches attended both virtually and in person.

Coaching development will remain a key priority within Volleyball Manitoba, as we develop plans and initiatives to further support and advance coaching in the province.

Dr. Dale Iwanoczko Memorial Volleyball Scholarships

Dale began his volleyball career playing for Lord Selkirk Regional High School and the University of Manitoba Bisons where he was named a five-time All-Canadian, was selected as the CIS/CIAU Most Valuable Player in 1990 and led the Bisons to the national championship title in 1991. He also played on Manitoba's Provincial and Canada Games Teams (85 & 87). He obtained his medical degree from the University of Manitoba, and sadly passed away at the age of 30, after succumbing to Hodgkin's disease, a battle he had fought valiantly for 14 months. Several of Dale's close friends established this scholarship through the Manitoba High Schools Athletic Association and Volleyball Manitoba in his honour and memory.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2026

The Finance Committee presents the audited financial statements for the year ended March 31, 2026. The statements were audited by Gislason Targownik Peters Chartered Professional Accountants LLP, who issued an unmodified opinion.

Volleyball Manitoba ended the year with a final surplus of **\$263,907** and unrestricted net assets of **\$585,893**, compared to \$321,986 at March 31, 2025.

1. 2025–26 Financial Results

Volleyball Manitoba recorded **\$2,130,280 in revenue** and **\$1,862,965 in operating expenses**, resulting in an operating surplus of **\$267,315**. After amortization of \$3,408, the Association reported a final **surplus of \$263,907** for the fiscal year.

The prior year ended with a deficit of \$15,173.

The surplus was supported by SuperSpike and merchandise revenue exceeding budget, higher registrations, membership growth including developmental and coach memberships, and lower expenses in areas such as beach leagues and Safe Sport Initiatives.

The audited results include **\$258,400** in VC Nationals revenue and **\$215,583** in related expenses from hosting the Volleyball Canada 14U National Championships. This was a **one-time 2025–26 event** and should not be considered recurring annual activity.

2. 2026–27 Budget

The Board approved the 2026–27 Operating Budget, with projected revenues of **\$1,957,284**, projected expenses of **\$1,957,086**, and projected net income of **\$198**.

The budget does not include a repeat of the one-time 14U Nationals hosting revenue or expenses.

3. Appreciation

The Finance Committee thanks Volleyball Manitoba staff and Sport Manitoba's finance team for their work supporting responsible financial management and reporting.

4. Recommendations to Membership – 2026 AGM

The Finance Committee recommends that the membership:

1. **Accept the audited 2025–26 Financial Statements** as presented in the 2026 Annual Report; and
2. **Appoint Gislason Targownik Peters Chartered Professional Accountants LLP as auditors for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2027.**

Opinion

In preparing the financial statements, management is responsible for assessing the entity's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the entity's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the entity to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

1. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Operating as Volleyball Manitoba, the Manitoba Volleyball Association Inc. is a non-profit organization and is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 149 of the Canadian Income Tax Act. The purpose of the organization is to provide quality services and programs that will assist in the promotion, development, and growth of volleyball in Manitoba.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the organization have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Subsequent measurement of financial assets and liabilities are at amortized cost unless otherwise noted. Financial assets and liabilities measured at amortized cost consist of cash, accounts receivable and accounts payable.

It is management's opinion that the organization is not exposed to significant credit, currency, interest rate, liquidity or market risks arising from these financial instruments, unless otherwise noted.

Capital assets

Capital assets are recorded at cost and are being amortized on the straight line basis at the following rates based on estimated useful life, except in the year of acquisition, when one-half of the rate is used:

Computer hardware	2 years
Equipment	5 years

The organization reviews capital assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable. Contributed capital assets are recorded at fair value at the date of contribution.

Contributed services and materials

A substantial number of volunteers contribute a significant amount of their time each year. Due to the difficulty of determining the fair market value, contributed services are not recognized in the financial statements.

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Unrestricted donations are recognized as revenue in the year received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured. Externally restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized.

The organization accounts for other revenues using the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations requires management to make estimates that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities as at the date of the financial statements, as well as reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. These estimates are subject to measurement uncertainty, and the effect on the financial statements of changes in such estimates in future periods could be significant.

3. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

The company has a line of credit available to a maximum of \$25,000, repayable on demand with interest at the rate of prime plus 3%. Bank indebtedness is secured by general security agreement providing a floating charge on all assets of the organization.
